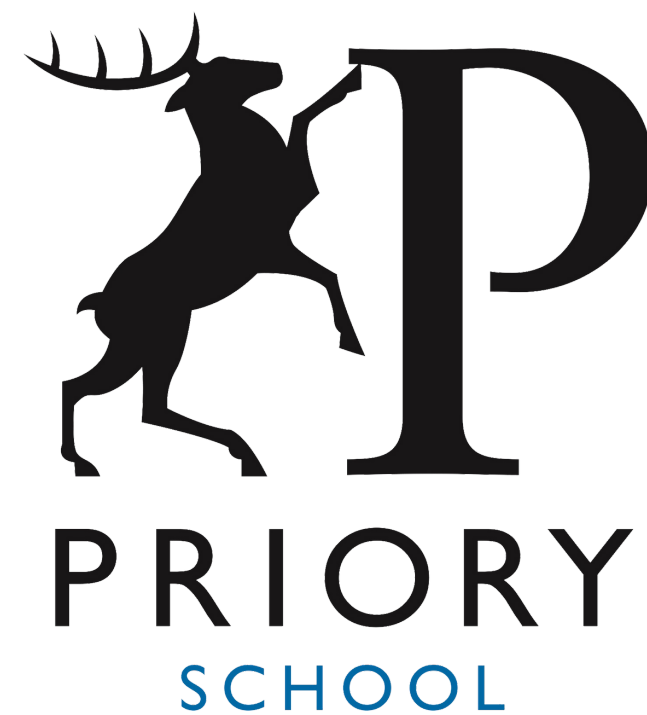


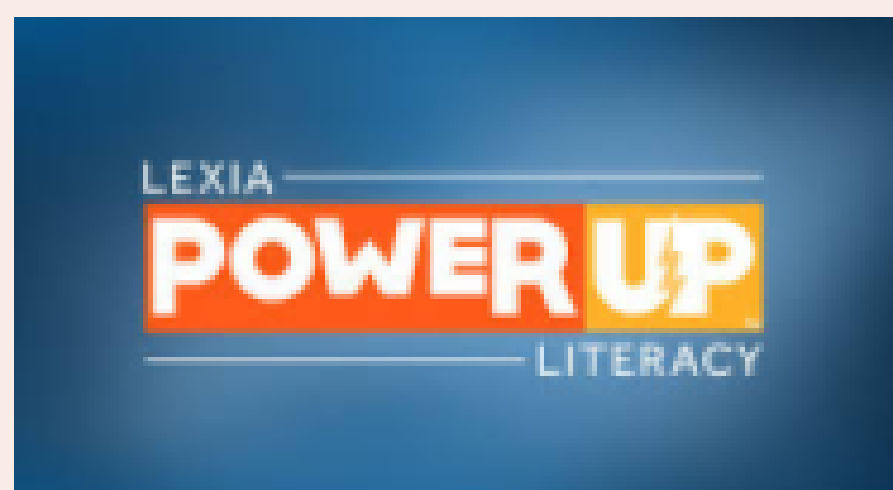
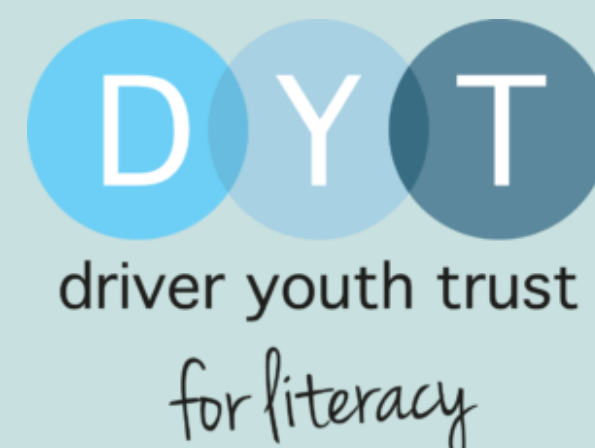
Supporting Reading During Home Learning

Lexia PowerUp

All Year 7s (and some Yr 8–11 students) have the continued opportunity to access Lexia® PowerUp Literacy® at home. Lexia is a computer-based programme that tailors instruction to students' specific Literacy needs. The activities in PowerUp support and build on our English language classroom curriculum, focusing on

developing skills essential in becoming a confident reader. Your child will have one dedicated English lesson a week during home learning where they will work on the programme. They can also log on at any time to complete additional minutes on the programme.
